Be sure to ascend the Holy Hill, a nature preserve and renowned pilgrimage site offering breathtaking views from atop St. Sebastian's Church.

Chateau Mikulov - audio guide offered, payment cash or by card

<u>Holy Hill</u> – easy ascent to the hill following the Way of the Cross takes approximately 30 minutes and will offer you stunning views over the city

<u>The Synagogue</u> – tours not guided, multilingual written materials are available, payment only by cash

<u>Dietrichstein Tomb</u> – tours not guided, multilingual written materials are available, payment only by cash

<u>Na Turoldu Cave</u> – warm clothes recommended (average temperature inside is 7-9 °C), payment cash or by card

<u>Tourist information centre</u> – open every day 9.00-18.00, guided city tours in foreign languages are provided only for groups upon request, reservation ahead is needed, for more information contact the centre

How to get there

By train or bus, approximate travelling time: 75 minutes one way.

By direct bus: From <u>Brno, ÚAN Zvonařka</u> to <u>Mikulov, u parku</u>

By train: From Brno Hl. nádraží to Mikulov na Moravě and you need to transfer in
